Josiah's Soap Box—St. Valentine & The Different Types of Love

It's over already?! That's right! February is over! It seems like it just started. Where did all that time go? Oh wait, February is the shortest month in the year. Anyways, if February is famous for one thing, it's Groundhog Day. You know, the movie with Bill Murray. Excuse me, what I meant to say was that February is famous for St. Valentine's Day. Every year, in the shortest month of the year, on the fourteenth day of that month, we celebrate...um...what do we celebrate? Oh, that's right, we celebrate romance. But, wait a second, what's the deal with this St. Valentine person? Also, besides St. Valentine, are we really just celebrating romance or is there something more to it?

First things first. Who is St. Valentine? Now, I've actually known this story for some time but, to make sure I kept my facts straight, I went to www.britannica.com for my information. Basically, St. Valentine was a Christian martyr during the persecution of the Christians. This means that he died for his faith in Christ during the time that the Roman Empire didn't really like Christianity. When he was captured, he was held as a prisoner for some time before his execution. During this time, he was able to meet his jailer's daughter, and they became good friends. Just to be clear, St. Valentine was a grown man and the daughter was a young child, so don't get any ideas. Because of St. Valentine's care for her, God used him to heal her of her blindness. The two wrote letters to each other and St. Valentine always signed them with the phrase, "from your Valentine." This is where we get the saying, "be my Valentine".

To further analyze this story, St. Valentine didn't have to interact with the daughter, let alone heal her. Why would St. Valentine want to help her? I mean, she was the daughter of the man who was keeping St. Valentine in his cell before his death. I believe it is because St. Valentine wanted to show the love that Jesus showed when He was a human and still shows all of us to this day. I'm talking about sacrificial love. Both Jesus and St. Valentine showed this type of love to everyone, even to their executioners on the brink of death. Just like we are taught at ACCA, Jesus and St. Valentine finished strong, even up to their deaths, by showing love to all people. In fact, St. Valentine's act of love towards the daughter of the jailer allowed him to lead her and her father to the Lord.

Remember, St. Valentine was just a human like you and me. He did what we all should be doing: living by Christ's example. What is even greater is that Jesus takes it even further. He had enough love to become human and take on all of our sins, have His Father look away from Him, and die a most painful death for YOU! Plus, He conquered death so that we could have eternal life. CHANGE IN TUITION 2019-2020 DISCOUNTS!

In order to assist families with multiple children who wish to attend ACCA, the Board of Directors voted to give higher tuition discounts than previously published. We hope this helps our current families and any new families considering ACCA. Remember that early registration for next year is only \$25 until April 26. 




Student Artwork

There is the love between two people that are engaged. A fiancée loves his/her partner so much that he/she tries to help that partner prepare for marriage. The two now know that they will be married, but they need to be ready for their future lives together. While they certainly must not commit certain sins pertaining to their relationship, they still need to make their relationship serious and firm enough for marriage. The only way they can do that properly is through sharing God's love together. I also desire this type of love, someday.

There is the love between those who are bonded in marriage. Marriage is a bond of holy matrimony. It is a commitment where a spouse will try their best to be there for their partner in all circumstances and situations. It is a bond God has placed between two people because He sees that they can fulfill his plan better together, rather than separately. They try to be strong where the other is weak. They support each other because the two become one. They sacrifice all they can for each other, even to the point of their lives. The two are equal because they each have unique tasks to help build each other up. The husband does his best to protect his wife. He leads the family. He makes sure his wife can progress, even if it means that he can't. The wife does her best to show her affection for her husband. She follows her husband's decisions in the family. She makes sure her husband can progress, even if it means that she can't. The only way that this can happen is through a love for each other blessed by God. I also desire this type of love, someday.

There is the love for all people, an extension of the sacrificial love that we talked about earlier. This love is basically just following Christ's example. It is the same love that St. Valentine expressed to the jailer's daughter. No matter where people come from, you still love them because Christ loves them. "Enemy" is just another word for a person that is spiritually lost like you were, but is expressing their sorrow through hatred. I assure you, being a light to people by loving them will make an impact. This is a love that every believer should have.

The ultimate love that you should have is the love for God. He is our Master and we are His servants. We should do anything He asks of us because we love Him. Our love for Him should be like a 'thank-you' for all that He has done for us. If you do not have this love, then all of the others fall short.

So, let's sum up what we have here. We celebrate St. Valentine's Day in honor of a man who gave one of the best examples of Christ's love. We celebrate all types of love because we are thankful that God gave them to us. Ultimately, we celebrate Christ's love for us.

Love is a very powerful thing. When Jesus was asked what is the greatest commandment, He said, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets."" (Matthew 22:37-40). Paul further expanded this by saying, "Owe no one anything except to love one another, for he who loves another has fulfilled the law. For the commandments, . . . are all summed up in this saying, namely, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no harm to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfillment of the law." (Romans 13: 8-10). It should be obvious at this point that you really should just love.

Now, you might be asking, "What is love? I know there are different types. But, in general what is love?" Well, my friend, Paul has you covered. He wrote this to the Corinthians: "Love suffers long and is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not puffed up; does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil; does not rejoice in iniquity, but rejoices in the truth; bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails." (I Corinthians 13: 4-8). If you apply this definition to all the different types of love that we looked at, I think you will find it fits into every single one. The only way these types of love can do this is by being rooted in God because God is love.

In conclusion, love. Just love. Love how God has called you to love. Love because it builds up all people. Love like there is no tomorrow, since we are not promised the next day. Love whole-heartedly. Love with Christ's example. Love. Just love.
